I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 2:34 p.m.

II. Welcome/Introductions

CQM Support Staff welcomed all attendees, made a statement of the meeting's goal, and made individual introductions.

III. Medical Case Management SDM Update

A representative from the Part A Recipient office led a discussion on the MCM Service Delivery Model which was reviewed and approved by the HIV Planning Council. She asked the MCM Network for any feedback as they reviewed the document. Some of the input from the network included adding language on EHE and changing the Broward Outcome and Indicator to reflect the data for MCM. A representative from Broward House suggested decreasing Indicator 1.2 from 90% to 85%. The Recipient's office agreed to these changes.

IV. FY23-24 Quarter 3 Care Continuum Data Presentation

The CQM Support Staff, DL, presented Quarter 3 Care Continuum data from this fiscal year as it pertained to the MCM Network. CQM Support Staff compared quarter three for both fiscal year 2022-2023 and 2023-2024. The MCM Network displayed numbers in the 80th to 90th percentile across the entire care continuum, including in care, prescribed ARVs, and viral suppression. For Q3 data, the overall viral suppression for the MCM Health Network decreased by 3.3% during the reporting period.

Additionally, the service category data was drilled down by three subpopulations: gender, race/ethnicity, and age. For each subpopulation, FY23-24 Q3 data was compared to FY22-23 Q3 data. Starting with the gender subpopulation, the transgender clients (N=10) had a notable decrease of 15.71% in viral suppression between the reporting periods. For retention in care, the female (0.48%) and transgender (4.29%) clients both increased, while the male clients had a decrease of 4%. For prescribed ARV, all the subpopulations decreased within the reporting period are as follows: female (5.63%), male (2.05%), and transgender (5.71%).

Following gender, CQM Support Staff focused on the race/ethnicity subpopulation. For retention in care, the Black Non-Hispanic (2%), Hispanic/Latinx (4.25%), and White Non-Hispanic (2.5%) clients all decreased between the reporting period. Black non-Hispanic (5%), Hispanic/Latinx (1.01%), and White Non-Hispanic (0.11%) also had an overall decrease in viral suppression between the reporting periods. For retention in care, all the age groups had decreased between the reporting period, with age 29-38(4.44%) having the highest decrease. For viral suppression, the age group 39-48 had a notable decrease of 8.8%.
